- iii. Preparing resource group & teachers in C.C. Tamil viddiyalaya in Zonal education office Balangoda for Tamil medium lessons.
- iv. Obtaining video support from Sabaragamuwa provincial audio visual media unut
- v. Preparing 60 video lessons based on writing activities with
  60 letters of singhala medium with correct shape & pattern

- vi. Preparing video lessons for writing letters in tamil medium.
- vii. Prepared 18 video lessons for writing Hindu Arabic numerals in Sinhala and Tamil medium
- viii. Providing 118 relevant video lessons as DVD / CD to students.
- ix. Providing relevant video lessons as Pen Drives to 1004 schools with the support of UNICEF.
- x. Preparation of online learning opportunities as interactive lessons through the Sabaragamuwa Provincial Education Department's e - Nanapiyasa website.

# RESULTS

- i. Preparing video lessons on writing letters & numbers as DVD / CD / Pen Drive and Providing Opportunities for students to study them at home and in the school classroom.
- ii. The inclusion of relevant video lessons as a series of interactive video lessons into sabaragamuwa province e – Nanapiyasa.
- iii. Providing all the active video lessons to all school through pen drives with the help of UNICEF.
- iv. Follow-up and regulation of the methods and use of the students studying the relevant video lessons.
